During the Spring Testing held in April our students that scored in the High to Average range were: 81% in Reading, 72% in Math, and 89% in Language.

Our eighth grade class graduated on Tuesday – May 28<sup>th</sup> at our Graduation and Awards Night Celebration. This year's class included: Samantha Gerdes, Morgan Harrison, Kendra Klimek, Audrey Kuhnau, Marly Nolz, and Charlie Mistele. We wish them God's Blessings as they move on to high school.

Also moving on this year to different paths in their lives are: Karrie Anderson – our Pre-Kindergarten teacher; Becky Mistele – who has been one of our Kindergarten aides for several years; Lynette Swedberg – our part-time middle school aide; and Jaci Loween – our part-time middle school teacher. We thank them for their service to Zion Lutheran School and wish them well.

Other activities take place in the school during the summer time. Wendy Simonson and Barb Chan, along with various helpers, run our summer breakfast and lunch program.
